- Luke 15:1-10
- Am I glad our Saviour is our Shepherd
- Christianity is the only religion where the Saviour seeks the sinner
- 2 - Two groups of people came to see Jesus. "Sinners" and the "Self-righteous"
- 3-4 – Jesus, speaking to the "Self- Righteous" asks a very practical, relevant question.
- 5-6 – The joy over a found lost sheep
- 7 – There is more joy in heaven over 1 lost sinner repenting than 99 righteous in church

The Lost Coin

- 8 - The woman's lost coin
- The lost coin could either be dowery or wedding attire or daily living. Could be more emotional than financial
- The lost coin is a picture of the lost soul that God cares about.



Cancel Culture And The Church
